

ESC 2022 Member's Questionnaire

Thanks to all who took the time to complete the questionnaire that was sent to all members late last summer. In total we had 97 members respond, which is an outstanding level of contribution — it goes to show how committed our members are to helping ensure the club functions as we want it to. The board has been compiling and reviewing the responses over the last few months and are committed to acting on the advice, suggestions, and ideas you have provided.

We thought it was appropriate to share some of the results with you. As such, the following is some of the data collected through the survey.

Q1. How long have you collected stamps? (91 responses)

- 0 - 2 years: 1 (1%)

- 2 - 10 years: 5 (5%)

- 10 – 20 years: 2 (2%)

20+ years: 83 (91%)

Q2. How old were you when you started collecting stamps? (84 responses)

Under 10 years old: 36 (43%)

- 10 - 19 years old: 33 (39%)

- 20 – 29 years old: 5 (6%)

- 30 - 39 years old: 3 (4%)

- 40 – 49 years old: 0 (0%)

- 50 - 59 years old: 5 (6%)

60 - 69 years old: 2 (2%)

Q3. How would you classify yourself as a stamp collector? (91 responses)

- Beginner/Novice: 5 (5%)

- Intermediate: 52 (57%)

Advanced: 34 (37%)

Q4. How long have you been a member of the ESC? (89 responses)

- 0 - 2 years: 8 (9%)

- 2 - 5 years: 6 (7%)

- 5 – 10 years: 11 (12%)

- 10+ years: 67 (75%)

Q5. How often do you attend ESC Meetings?

- Nearly every meeting 28% of respondents
- More than half of the meetings 10%
- One-quarter to one-half of the meetings 13%
- Once or twice per year 13%
- Seldom or never 36%

Q7. Rank your enjoyment of the following components of ESC meetings from 1 to 5, with 1 being the activity you enjoy most.

Club Auction

- 44% of respondents rated the auction as their favorite activity.
- 19% rated in second.
- 16% rated it third.
- 16% rated it fourth.
- 4% rated in as their least favorite activity.

Consignment (Estate) Auction

- 23% of respondents rated the consignment (estate) auction as their favorite activity.
- 23% rated it second.
- 21% rated it third.
- 15% rated it fourth.
- 19% rated it as their least favorite activity.

Silent Auction

- 7% of respondents rated the silent auction as their favorite activity.
- 16% rated it second.
- 28% rated it third.
- 22% rated it fourth.
- 28% rated it as their least favorite activity.

Member Presentations

- 37% of respondents rated member presentations as their favorite activity.
- 28% rated it second.
- 11% rated it third.
- 18% rated it fourth.
- 6% rated it as their least favorite activity.

Socializing

- 36% of respondents rated socializing as their favorite activity.
- 20% rated it second.
- 24% rated it third.
- 9% rated it fourth.
- 12% rated it as their least favorite activity.



On 13 September 1940 the Italian 10th Army advanced out of Libya and invaded Egypt, initiating the North Africa Campaigns of WWII. During the back-and-forth movements of the armies the Italians garrisoned the Siwa Oasis three times. It is a small town of Senussi order Arabs.



1942 was the last time the Italians were in the Siwa Oasis. At this time the Italians set up an ineffectual short-lived Egyptian government-in-exile. The Italians also inaugurated a "postal system."

This was certainly only another propaganda gesture. They did not use Italian stamps. To my surprise, the Italians must have found a quantity of Egyptian stamps, Scott #s 206-215.

The only known examples of these stamps are hand (?) overprinted OASI DI SIWA / OCCUPAZIONE / MILITARE / ITALIANA. To me, these overprinted stamps do not appear to be for use by an Egyptian government-in-exile but as an Italian occupation stamp.

This unique set is purported to have been picked up by an Italian lieutenant stationed at Siwa Oasis in 1942. This officer was an avid stamp collector who returned home after the war with this stamp set.

There are no used stamps from this stamp set. This set was examined by the well known Egyptian philatelist Ahmed Mazloum, who concluded that "the official character of these stamps is lacking". Several years ago, this set sold for €2800. In Zurich, December 2021 this set went unsold with an opening estimate of €6500- €7500.
