

President's Message

The Edmonton Stamp Club is closing the old year, 2017/2018 following our annual election of the ESC Board with an increase in the number of Directors working for us in the upcoming year 2018/2019. It is a good mix of new members and, I was going to say old members, but that is not accurate, the correct term in seasoned and experienced members. We need this mix of energy and knowledge. The Board has the task of continuing the normal operations of the club. We have now purchased a new microphone/amplifier system but still need to find the best microphone to effectively use the system. The newly elected Board has several concepts for development and member recruitment both to test their practicality but also assess the membership's interest while staying within our financial constraints. We will continue the seminars at the regular general ESC meetings which will include a monthly Ernie's Philatelic Knowledge seminar as part of the seminar/talks supervised by Keith Spencer. The regular meetings' auction and the silent auction will continue as usual.

The Spring Show Committee has met to start planning for the 2019 Spring Show. While the theme for this show has not yet been chosen this committee is looking at adding seminars to the Spring Show. In addition, they are investigating enhancing the kids table with a specific kid's activity or event. The Spring Show Committee, recognizing how tremendously successful the stamp collection evaluation table manned by Keith Spencer is in drawing in the public to the show will need suggestions and offers of assistance to come up with suggestions to reduce the wait times for the public. In addition, we are actively looking for a local group to cooperate with us at this upcoming Spring Show. We have sent a letter to The Philatelic History Society of Canada asking them if they would be interested in co-operating together with us at a future Spring Show. The newly elected Board will have to consult with the membership and the Spring Show Committee about these and other initiatives as they arise.

As you are aware the 2018 Summer Meeting and Auction is being held on July 30 at the Lions Center. As announced at the regular meetings, for the first time we are offering mail bidding to our members and the members of other prairie stamp clubs to the Summer Meeting auction. I, as President of the ESC have been in contact with the other presidents of the prairie stamp clubs. Interest has been expressed for the need of a larger stamp auction within Alberta.

Centre Street Bridge, Calgary Alberta by Barend Wissink 7TH In Series Bridges of Alberta

This is the first non rail bridge and also the first all concrete bridge in the series Yes Calgary gets the nicest bridge of this type award from me. The first cross-




was Fogg's Ferry in 1882. A.J. McArthur owned and subdivided Crescent Heights in 1906 sold lots to speculators and promised a bridge connecting

built in 1907 was installed at a cost of \$17,000. A battle raged between the City and McArthur over maintenance costs. Between 1908 and 1912 traffic got so heavy that the planking had to be constantly replaced. McArthur put up a toll



gate in 1911 to recoup the costs. The 1907 steel truss bridge can be seen in the first post card by John Valentine & Sons numbered JV107819 which would date it at 1911. McArthur got tired of the fight tried to sell it to the city for the original cost


and wound up selling it for \$1300. The McArthur Bridge flooded in 1915. Demolition of the existing bridge was done and materials sold for \$1500 and a



temporary bridge was installed. The new bridge designed by John F. Green, was built for the City over the Bow River at a cost of \$375,000 in 1916, the lowest cost possible. So it started as a no frills bridge devoid of any ornamentation.

Now comes the story of the guarding lions. In 1916 a city alderman saw a statue of a lion on the front step of a house in Calgary's North West.


As luck would have it the artist James L. Thompson a Scottish stone mason was already working as a city labourer and still sculpted in his spare time. The City pulled him off his labour job and




gave him a shed near the bridge to sculpt four lions for the bridge in the winter of 1916, having them ready to install by the summer of 1917. He also did all

of the other ornamentation on the kiosks. Roses for England, Shamrocks for Ireland, Thistles for Scotland, Maple Leafs for Canada, and Buffalo heads for

Western Canada.

It is a GM advertising post card



with a Oldsmobile Sports Coupe, it was mailed in 1931 On the back it gives credit to the Canadian Pacific Railway for the illustration.



It is a 2 level bridge the upper deck is a reinforced concrete arch structure that spans 584 ft. and is 49 ft. wide. The lower deck is 490 ft. long and 18 ft. wide and has a height clearance of 8 ft. 10 in.



An Irresistible Auction Lot

This winter perusing the regular stamp club's meeting silent auction table there sits a lot of 7 mint stamps (Fig 1) under the owner's statement "I

do not know what these stamps are".



A mystery with an itsy bitsy opening bid. NO worry about explaining anything to She Who Must Be Obeyed! Darn, I should know what these stamps are, but I am experiencing a mind freeze and I do not know the identity of these stamps. I ask around me. I get answers such as "I don't know," or "I do not collect them". Like a shark I circle the silent auction table. Oh no another scavenger is homing in on this lot. I move and intercept. We talk. I point out that they are probably forgeries. He signed the bid sheet. He is gone so I wiggle over and raise the bid. Time has been declared and now I can scoop in and fondle my prize.

I am home and find out that my memory is no longer that of a youth of 65 years. I have to use a stamp identifier. Several stamp identifiers later I know these stamps are from the Republic of North Ingermanland. Where and what is North Ingermanland?

North Ingermanland is a dead country, 9 July 1919 to 5 June 1920. Ingerland is located on the northern part of the Karelian Isthmus connecting Russia and Finland (Fig 2). The seven stamps in this lot (Scott #8-14) compose the second (last) set of this country. Counterfeits, particularly from the 1950 era abound. I found only two different overprints on the web Next page



for North Ingermanland stamps. First (Fig 3) the overprint translates as Specimen. This overprint is on a Scott #7, the last stamp in the first North Ingermanland stamp set.

The second overprint was probably only overprinted on the second set of stamps. However, my interpretation of the information may be too precise. The second overprint was placed on North Ingermanland stamps after the Bolsheviks had reoccupied the capital city Kirjasalo and the Treaty of Tartu formalized the Russo/Finnish back to the pre-Republic of North Ingermanland location. Some authors call the next overprint a Finish charity issue while others a North Ingermanland revenue stamp. The

These overprinted stamps were printed in Finland in 1921 in quantities of 2,000 each supposedly only on the three stamps with denominations in marks (Fig 4). These stamps were sold at face value.

However (Fig 5) contradicts this statement. This is an area that needs further study. More information is welcome.

Stamps

One of the most frequent questions I received from beginning collectors pertains to the identification of various stamps. Not all stamps have the name of their country printed on them and of course, many others are spelled in languages other than English.

The following guide could be of use to most of these collectors and I suggest you clip and fasten it to the inside of your album.

In most cases the wording as it appears on the stamp appears first, followed by the name of the country as we know it.

- No name, but the portrait of either Queen Victoria, Edward VIII, George V, George VI, or Queen Elizabeth II and values in pence or pounds - Great Britain
