



Sam G Chiu, Ph.D., FRPSC

Sam has been collecting since childhood, but only became serious in collecting since early 1980's. He collects mostly China and Hong Kong as well as some British Commonwealth countries. He has evolved from collecting just stamps to collecting postal history, even though he still has all of his stamp collections. He also collects postal stationery. When he was asked to become a philatelic judge was when he began to exhibit. Sam in is an RPSC accredited philatelic judge at the national level in Canada and in 2004 he became an accredited FIP judge at the international level judging postal history.

He has been jury chair in several shows including the Royal 2008 and now Royal 2012. Sam was called to the Roll of the Fellows of the Royal Philatelic Society of Canada in 2010. Besides judging in Canada and the US, Sam has judged shows in Singapore, China and Hong Kong.

Sam likes to think of himself as a collector and exhibitor first. He has several different multi-frames International level exhibits that have achieved at least a Large Vermeil.

Sam was asked by the RCMP in the early 1990's to be the expert witness in a case involving the forgery of Chinese stamps in Toronto. Sam was on the Canada Post Advisory Committee for two terms from 2006.

He co-wrote *Postage Due and the handling of Underpaid mail of Hong Kong*. Sam, together with several China postal history collectors, started the Postal History Society of China. \Box



Robert K. Lane, Ph.D.

Bob's philatelic interests are mainly with postal history, specializing in Railway Post Office postmarks for Manitoba. He has several published philatelic articles and his exhibits have been successful both nationally and internationally. He has served as Webmaster for the BNAPS, and is presently on the Editorial Committee of the Postal History Society of Canada. He has served several times on national


exhibition juries, including the Calgary Royal.



Doug Lingard

Doug, who lives in Ottawa, as been actively involved in philately since the early 1970's. For eight years, he was the Vice President of Study Groups in BNAPS and for the past 13 years, he has been Chairman of the national level ORAPEX show in Ottawa. He became a national level judge in 1994 and has been judging at BNAPEX and national level shows since then, including the 2001, 2004 and 2007 RPSC shows. Doug has been exhibiting since the late 1970's. His greatest exhibiting achievements have been winning an ORAPEX Grand Award in 1994 and a BNAPEX

Reserve Grand Award in 2006. He also received an international large silver award, for his literature entry at CAPEX '96.



Dickson Preston

Dickson Preston resides in Seattle, U.S.A. He collects and exhibits commercial zeppelin mail, twentieth century U.S. postal history, and Scandinavia. His exhibits have won gold medals and special awards both nationally and internationally. He has been an APS accredited judge for twenty-five years.

After 41 years, Rob continues to enjoy teaching in North Vancouver and shares his life and stamps with his wife Barbara and two adult children.




Robert K (Rob) Lunn

"Have read book I repudiate it":

a publishing history of Sir Sam Steele's memoir "Forty Years in Canada"

Alison Rukavina, Ph.D. (English & Film Studies, University of Alberta)

Sir Samuel Benfield Steele wanted with the publication of his memoir, Forty Years in Canada; reminiscences of the great north-west with some accounts of his service in South Africa, to take control of his public image and counteract the exaggeration and myth making of press and fictional accounts of his life. If Steele had one goal it was to commit to paper a truthful history of the Red River Rebellion, the Klondike Gold Rush, and other incidents and events Steele either witnessed or in which he participated as soldier or member of the North-West Mounted Police. However, the publication of the memoir in 1915 would leave Steele angry that the truth and history had both been compromised, as he saw it, for business reasons. In this talk, I will outline the publishing history of Steele's memoir, including his work with Winnipeg Telegram journalist Mollie Glenn Niblett, who acted as his agent and editor. Furious his representative had let this unsatisfactory first edition be published, Steele nevertheless eventually forgave Niblett, but he would channel his anger and dismay in an attempt to bully his British publisher Herbert Jenkins into agreeing to publish a two-volume second edition that would correct the perceived wrongs of the first edition. No second edition was ever published but my recent work in the archive at the University of Alberta has uncovered clues that one may have been written before Steele's death in 1919.

Alison Rukavina is currently an instructor in the English and Film Studies department at the University of Alberta and the English review editor of Papers of the Bibliographical Society of Canada. Palgrave Macmillan published her book The Development of the International Book Trade: Tangled Networks last year. The book examines the transnational book trade that emerged between 1870 and 11895 in Europe, North America, Asia, Africa and Australia. Her research interests include the international book trade, transnational and imperial social networks, Canadian publishing history, and author-publisher relations.

100 Years of Organized Philately in Edmonton

1912 was an exciting year in this part of the world, as the City of Strathcona (south Edmonton) and the Village of North Edmonton were amalgamated into the City of Edmonton. The newspaper headlines told the story of the sinking of the *Titanic*. There was a building boom going on in Edmonton: over a dozen multi-storey buildings were constructed of bricks and mortar for businesses, a large church, and two hospitals. Many of these buildings are still in use. This was also the year that an Edmonton stamp club started. The newest stamps for that year were from the long-lasting Admiral set: 7¢ yellow and 10¢ purple, as well as

the 1¢ green and 2¢ red coil stamps in rolls of 100 or more.

As the city and the club grew, the Edmonton Stamp Club (ESC) held its meetings in the "Old Library" downtown, where the significantly taller Telus tower currently stands. Just after the CN tower was built in 1965, the club moved it meetings to the 5th floor cafeteria there. In 1975, the club met in the basement of McDougall United Church across from the Edmonton *Journal* building, near the Chateau Lacombe Hotel, where several annual Spring Stamp Shows were held.

Because of the rapid growth of the Club, the meetings were moved to the 4th floor cafeteria at St. Joseph High School, where they have remained except for 1998-2000, when the school was renovated and meetings were held



at Archbishop MacDonald High School. Finally the club moved its meetings back to St. Joe's cafeteria, where it still meets today.

The success of our club has been all thanks to the dedication of many volunteers over about hundred years, people who shared the great hobby of stamp collecting.



Meetings of the ESC are normally held every two weeks from September through June. The evening events usually include a silent auction, circuit books, announcements, a brief program presented by one of our members, and a members' club auction. There is also a summer meeting and auction held on the last Monday of July.

Our annual Spring National Stamp Show has been held at the Fantasyland Hotel in West Edmonton Mall over the last 25 years. This show is a national level show with over 100 frames (each of 16 pages) of competitive stamp exhibits. Over the years many members of our club have exhibited locally, nationally and internationally, winning awards at all level of competition. In the fall of each year, we host a Fall Stamp Market at which dealers sell and buy stamps. This year the club is, for the third time, hosting the convention of the Royal Philatelic Society of Canada, the most important stamp show in Canada.

The ESC is Life Chapter #6 of the RPSC, is a member chapter of the APS, and maintains a close working relationship, and friendly rivalry, with the Calgary Philatelic Society. The ESC has also hosted BNAPEX (British North America Philately show) and, less frequently, PIPEX (Pacific International Philatelic Exhibition).


